AAUS Foundation Scholarship Awards 2013

AAUS Foundation offers three competitive scholarship programs: the Kathy Johnston English (KE) award for doctoral-level students, the Kevin Gurr (KG) award for master-level students, and the Hollis gear award. This year, as in most other years, there were applicants for the AAUS scholarships whose academic advisors were reviewers or members of the scholarship committee. It is the policy of this committee that in these cases, advisors are not involved in the reviewing or ranking of their own students' proposals.

First place awards (KE and KG) are \$3000; second place awards are \$1500. A total of 45 proposals were reviewed (22 KE and 23 KG). Proposals ranged from tropical to temperate studies and spanned fields from ecology to archaeology. Best wishes to all who participated. Special thanks to the seven anonymous reviewers. Kathy Johnston English Award

1st place - Lillian Tuttle, Oregon State University Title: Effects of the invasive Pacific red lionfish (*Pterois volitans*) on native Atlantic goby cleaning mutualisms.

2nd place - Darcey Bradley, UC Santa Barbara Title: Incorporating behavior into an estimate of reef shark population abundance at a pristine coral reef.

Kevin Gurr Award

1st place - Scott Gabara, Moss Landing Marine Labs Title: Drift kelp retention, habitat complexity, and macroinvertebrate species richness of coralline agal rhodolith beds at Santa Catalina Island, CA.

2nd place - Danielle Claar, University of Hawaii Title: Macroecology of microorganisms: *Symbiodinium* diversity across a gradient of anthropogenic stress and implications for coral reef resilience.

Hollis Gear Award

Hollis Gear (www.hollisgear.com) has graciously funded a new competitive scholarship program for AAUS student members. Awards are valued at \$1250 per recipient (\$1000 in Hollis diving equipment plus \$250 to cover dive training or academic diving travel costs). Two awards have been made for 2013. The first-place ranking goes to Emily Aiken, an undergraduate student in biology at California State University, Monterey Bay. The second-place ranking goes to Melanie Garate, a doctoral student in biology at the University of Rhode Island. We look forward to both winners using the equipment to advance their endeavors in underwater science. Thanks to the seven anonymous panelists that reviewed the applications.

2014 AAUS/OWUSS Internship

OWUSS is now taking applications for the 2014 AAUS/OWUSS scientific diving internship. applicants can be students from colleges and universities with an interest in science and diving. The program runs primarily from mid-May through August and will include training at one of several AAUS organizational member sites. This training will give the intern the necessary dive qualifications to allow participation on research projects requiring scientific diving and introduce the intern to careers that utilize scientific diving as a tool. Once trained as an AAUS-recognized diver-in-training, interns will participate in underwater field work at one or more locations and research facilities associated with the AAUS.
